






## **Congregational Meeting News**

## "I was able to change my economic status"

arida Begum has been telling her neighbors about how her life has changed. Farida is from Bangladesh, where she works as a housekeeper. She lives with her husband, who works as a field laborer for local farmers. and their eight children. The family's home is near the Lutheran Health Care Bangladesh (LHCB) Hospital.

While Farida knew about the services the hospital offered, things changed when she learned about its development work, especially the self-help groups for women, which are supported by your gifts to ELCA World Hunger. Women leaders have organized themselves into these mutual-support groups that provide an opportunity for savings, small business development, economic and financial training, and relational support. These groups are usually composed of 10 to 20 people.

"After six months of my joining in the Sreerampur-3 primary self-help women's group, I received homestead vegetable gardening, poultry and livestock trainings from LHCB," Farida explained. "I was changed and fully motivated to be involved with vegetable cultivation. My husband leased farmland from a neighbor and created this opportunity for me to cultivate my vegetables."

Now, in addition to her cleaning work, Farida has an extra income source: She grows vegetables on the leased land, and her husband takes them to the local market weekly to sell. This allows the couple to meet their children's basic needs and have extra income.

Since the COVID-19 pandemic hit, LHCB has made efforts to keep hospital services and programs running and functional during this challenging time. As economic and health challenges are compounded, LHCB is working hard to meet preexisting and new needs.

In addition to ongoing ELCA World Hunger-supported work, such as the self-help groups, Lutheran Disaster Response provided support to the hospital in its response to the COVID-19 pandemic.


Agricultural trainings that support the improved economic status of those like Farida and her family have had to adjust in light of physical distancing requirements. However, Farida continues to grow and sell her vegetables. and her family have received soap, masks and staple foods such as

rice, lentils and salt to help them

get through this challenging time.

#### **Easiest Biscuits Ever!**

3 cups flour

3 tsp. sugar

1 Tbsp. baking powder 1/4 tsp. baking soda

1 1/4 tsp. salt

2 cups cream

2 Tosp. unsaited butter, melted

Place a rack in the upper middle position in the oven, and preheat the oven to 450°F. Line a cookie sheet with parchment.\*

Mix dry ingredients.

Heat cream to 95-100° (warm) — about 60-90 seconds on high power in a microwave.

Combine wet and dry ingredients, and stir until smooth. It will look wet.

Using a 1/3 cup measuring cup as a scoop, drop dough onto parchment-lined cookie sheet

Bake for 10 minutes, rotating the cookie sheet halfway through. Brush with melted butter and cool for 5 minutes before serving.

Makes 10 biscuits.
