Worship back in the church sanctuary.....at last!

We missed three Sundays of worship while sheltering-in-place. We went to virtual worship as of Easter Sunday. Then as of July, we enjoyed "parking lot worship" while still streaming online. Now, finally, we've returned to worship in our beloved church sanctuary space!

We were safe and patient over the summer. But we are still very much aware that the pandemic is not over and safety measures are still crucial. So our re-opening celebration is on, with the following important details and instructions:



- For safety, hymnals, etc., have been removed from the backs of the pews.
- Hand sanitizer has been placed in the narthexes and elsewhere around the building.
- Sexton Tommy will have windows open the previous night so that the sanctuary is appropriately cool without use of floor fans (ceiling fans may be used if necessary).
- Full sanctuary will be opened (25% capacity is 70 persons; 50% is 140). Pew indicators will be placed to show where seating is allowed and social-distanced.
- Worship time continues to be 10:30 AM (rather than 9:15 AM), with Sunday School at 9:00 AM.
- An usher will ring the tower bell a few minutes before worship time.
- · Rest rooms will be open; nursery will be closed.
- Worshipers may use either entrance, before and after the service.
- Masks are required when entering, must remain on until seated in the pew, must be on when singing in the pew, and must be on when leaving the pew to socialize and/or exit after worship (those with medical condition are excepted - please call Pastor Tim ahead of time if this is your situation).



- Masks may be removed when you are seated in your pew, except when singing.
- Masks will be provided for those who do not have them.
- For those who can't stand masks(!), for those who are sick, or for those who aren't yet comfortable attending in person, worship will still be streamed on Facebook live.
- In order to be heard and understood, the Pastor is not to be masked while in the chancel; he is to wear mask while singing.
- Senior Choir members are encouraged to sit in the choir pews.
- All worship info will be printed in the bulletin; hymns will be the only
 portion of the service to be sung. We'll sing the first and last verses
 only.
- Large-print bulletins will be provided; children's bulletins will also be provided (parents are asked to bring crayons for their children from home)
- Acolytes will serve as scheduled; lectors are on hold for now (the Pastor will read the lessons and psalm).
- For safety, children's sermons are on hold for now.
- Offering will not be collected during the service; instead, receptacles will be provided in the narthexes for offerings as people enter or leave worship
- On Holy Communion Sundays, pre-packaged elements will be handed out with the bulletins as people enter; after consecration during worship, people will partake of the elements from their seats.

The above may seem a lot, but we want to continue to keep everyone as safe as possible. Basically speaking, if we all come with our faces covered and God's joy in our hearts, everything will be great!


During the holidays it is especially important for us to share everything with which God has blessed us. As you prepare your holiday menus and shopping lists, please remember those who are less fortunate.



"Peace be with you..."


We greet each other when we "pass the peace." What are we passing to our friends and neighbors?

Upcoming Blood Drive...

St John's will hold its annual blood drive on Saturday November 28, 2020 in the church social hall beginning at 8AM.

Many sites that normally host the Bloodmobile cannot do so because of the pandemic, and it has affected the available blood supply. We are encouraging you to sign up if you're able to donate blood. We are fortunate to have our Social Hall as a donation site because it has sufficient space for social distancing!



Added safety precautions are in place because of the pandemic:

All donors are asked to wear a mask. If you don't have one, Bloodmobile personnel will provide you with one.

Please arrive as close as possible to your appointment time, with your ID.

Upon check-in, each donor will have their temperature taken and answer COVID-19 screening questions before going to the registration area.

Following donation, donors will remain in the donor chair for the observation period (instead of sitting in the "canteen" area). Snacks and drinks will be offered at the chair.

At the completion of the observation time, donors are asked to leave the area.

All Bloodmobile personnel are required to wear personal protective equipment ("PPE"). All equipment is wiped down between donors.

TIPS AND GUIDELINES TO KEEP YOU HEALTHY
WHILE YOU DONATE BLOOD



Get plenty of sleep the night before. Donating blood may be easy but we want to be sure you're feeling your best. Some donors may feel tired after donating blood.



Be sure to eat a healthy and hearty meal the day before and day of your appointment. Avoid foods with excessive fat and sugar. Besides, we'll have tasty treats for you after you donate.



It's important to be well-hydrated before you donate blood. Be sure to drink plenty of fluids especially water, Gatorade or juice.

Important Information When You Arrive

If you are unable to keep your appointment time or will be more than 10 minutes late, please contact us as soon as possible to reschedule as we may not be able to accommodate donors arriving more than 10 minutes late for their appointment due to CDC and state guidelines on social distancing.



Be sure to wear a mask over your nose and mouth before entering the facility or donor center. Please maintain a 6-foot distance between yourself and any other individuals. Arrive as close as possible to your appointment time.



Please present your identification with you so we can check you in.



Be sure to schedule your next donation before you leave or online when you get home. Donations are by appointment only at this time; walk-ins will only be taken if there is an open appointment on the schedule.

If you're donating whole blood, you'll need to wait 8 weeks before you can donate whole blood again. You will need to wait 28 days to donate plasma. If you're donating convalescent plasma, you can donate convalescent plasma again after 28 days. When you schedule your appointment and need help please let us know by calling us at call us at 1-800-B-A-DONOR (1-800-223-6667) and press option #2.
