We welcome all to march with us wearing any costume you want (or even no costume at all). The important thing is to march and help us show St. John's support for our community.


Have fun greeting your Coplay neighbors! We'll march with the fire trucks, dance schools, scout troops, marching bands, and all the other community groups.

Upcoming Blood Drive...

St John's will hold its annual blood drive on Saturday November 27, 2021 in the church social hall beginning at 8AM.

Many sites that normally host the Bloodmobile cannot do so because of the pandemic, and it has affected the available blood supply. We are encouraging you to sign up if you're able to donate blood. We are fortunate to have our Social Hall as a donation site because it has sufficient space for social distancing!



Added safety precautions are in place because of the pandemic:

All donors are asked to wear a mask. If you don't have one, Bloodmobile personnel will provide you with one.

Please arrive as close as possible to your appointment time, with your ID.

Upon check-in, each donor will have their temperature taken and answer COVID-19 screening questions before going to the registration area.

Following donation, donors will be offered snacks and drinks for the observation period.

At the completion of the observation time, donors are asked to leave the area.

All Bloodmobile personnel are required to wear personal protective equipment ("PPE"). All equipment is wiped down between donors.

WHILE YOU DONATE BLOOD



Get plenty of sleep the night before. Donating blood may be easy but we want to be sure you're feeling your best. Some donors may feel tired after donating blood.



Be sure to eat a healthy and hearty meal the day before and day of your appointment. Avoid foods with excessive fat and sugar. Besides, we'll have tasty treats for you after you donate.



It's important to be well-hydrated before you donate blood. Be sure to drink plenty of fluids especially water, Gatorade or juice.

Important Information When You Arrive

If you are unable to keep your appointment time or will be more than 10 minutes late, please contact us as soon as possible to reschedule as we may not be able to accommodate donors arriving more than 10 minutes late for their appointment due to CDC and state guidelines on social distancing.



Be sure to wear a mask over your nose and mouth before entering the facility or donor center. Please maintain a 6-foot distance between yourself and any other individuals. Arrive as close as possible to your appointment time.



Please present your identification with you so we can check you in.



Be sure to schedule your next donation before you leave or online when you get home. Donations are by appointment only at this time; walk-ins will only be taken if there is an open appointment on the schedule.

If you're donating whole blood, you'll need to wait 8 weeks before you can donate whole blood again. You will need to wait 28 days to donate plasma. If you're donating convalescent plasma, you can donate convalescent plasma again after 28 days. When you schedule your appointment and need help please let us know by calling us at call us at 1-800-B-A-DONOR (1-800-223-6667) and press option #2.

If you have any questions, we're be more than happy to help. For information on Donor Eligibility, please visit GIVEaPINT.org/library/who-can-donate-blood or you can call us at 1-800-B-A-DONOR.



During uncertain times, churches are often a source of strength. Worship and fellowship provide comfort and help carry us through difficult times.

Iwant to thank St John Lutheran Church Coplay for being a witness to the love of Christ, bringing light to your community during the dark days of the pandemic. I also want to thank you for your past support.

As we give thanks, I want to share with you what Lutheran Congregational Services has been up to this past year.

We have long stood with the most vulnerable in our communities. At Lutheran Disaster Response – Eastern PA (LDR-EPa) a program of Lutheran Congregational Services, we have been as busy as ever.


We continue to help our neighbors in Eastwick, Philadelphia, a neighborhood that sits at the bottom of two large creeks and experiences repeated flash flooding. More than 60 families were affected by floods in 2020, leaving them without working refrigerators, hot water heaters, washers, and dryers. Additionally, many of the residents impacted were elderly, have medical conditions, or significant exacerbating circumstances due to the pandemic.

With the support of donations, LDR-EPa reached out a helping hand to ensure our neighbors stayed warm and comfortable in the cold months of winter. As I write this letter, our case manager continues to guide residents through the complicated process of obtaining resources through home heating and repair programs. These efforts are partially funded thanks to a grant from the ELCA Lutheran Disaster Response program.

Of course this past summer brought its own stormy weather, wreaking havoc across eastern Pennsylvania. Lutheran Disaster Response is actively engaged in helping homeowners and renters in Bucks and Philadelphia counties affected by flooding. While our assessments are ongoing, we estimate that at least 50 families will need long-term support on the road to recovery.

Additionally, throughout this past year, Lutheran Congregational Services was able to re-imagine the delivery of programs that support those who are grieving. While the pandemic may have limited our abilities to gather in-person, LCS harnessed our creativity and began to host our grief support groups virtually, thanks to our professional Grief Counselor, Sylvia Havlish.

Sylvia helps those grieving to heal and find hope again. With each session, she provides a safe space where individuals can explore their feelings of loss while learning the many stages of grief and how to navigate them. With over 40 years of experience, Sylvia knows that individuals who are grieving need a strong support system around them. She continues to provide this support with her virtual group meetings.








Your generosity has also helped us rejuvenate our Lay Eucharistic Visitor Training program as we transition and keep up with virtual times. Throughout the pandemic, we were able to find creative ways of ministering to people who are homebound.

Potato Pancakes

3 cups finely shredded peeled potatoes, well drained 2 eggs, well beaten 1 ½ Tbsp. flour

1/8 tsp. baking powder

½ to 1 tsp. salt
½ tsp. grated onion
Oil (for greasing the pan)
Applesauce, maple syrup, or
sour cream (optional)

In a mixing bowl, gently combine potatoes and eggs.

In a separate bowl, combine dry ingredients and onion. Stir into potato mixture.

Drop by tablespoonfuls onto a preheated greased skillet. Brown lightly on both sides.

Serve with applesauce, syrup, or sour cream as desired.

Yield: 12 (2-inch) pancakes.
