If you have a Cornhole set that we can use, please let me know.





NEVER FAIL CARAMEL PUDDING

1 1/2 cup brown sugar

34 cup water

4 tbsp. butter

½ tsp. salt

½ tsp. baking soda

6 cups milk

3 eggs, beaten

34 cup flour

1 tbsp. vanilla

- Combine brown sugar, water, butter and salt. Boil for 2 minutes. Add baking soda. Bring to a boil.
- 2. Mix milk, eggs, flour and vanilla. Add to cooked mixture. Cool until thick.

 Note: can use a double boiler, put kettle with about ½ water, then set stainless dish on top and put pudding in there; cook until thick, water will boil in kettle making pudding hot, it will not stick and get burned. Pour into blender to make smooth.
