## A Word From The Pastor...

Dear friends in Christ,

It is hard to believe that I am writing my September newsletter article already. Since beginning my time as your interim pastor, I have had a busy schedule. I have been seeing doctors, going to physical therapy, and ordering a new power wheelchair.

All of these things were slightly overdue and now are very easy to take care of because I have the resources of Good Shepherd Rehabilitation close by. I appreciate your understanding as I have been attending to my physical well-being and health. The first round of physical therapy is complete but another shorter one is likely on the horizon. I have not kept regular office hours during the summer. Once we are back on a fall schedule, I plan to be in the office once a week on a Thursday. If you are in need of pastoral care, or would just like a visit please contact me. My phone number is in the newsletter and on the website.

I plan to make contact with those of you who are on the shut in list very soon. This process has already started. I am continuing to get acquainted with the congregation and with my new surroundings. I appreciate all of you who have been so very flexible and understanding. Again, please do not hesitate to contact me if you are in need or just wish to say hello.

If you remember last month, I wrote an article detailing the function of an interim pastor. Now I want to say a word about the functioning of a congregation in the midst of a transition. Each congregation I have served looks a little bit different and functions differently, but there are a few things that are applicable to most congregations in transition.

Change is hard-Any change is hard. When a pastor leaves a congregation, that change can be especially hard for a host of reasons. As we continue to get to know each other, give yourselves the same Grace that you have given me. It is okay not to have every answer and the solution to every challenge. We may not have all the answers and we may not have every solution, but we already have and we will continue to grow together.

In this time of transition, be flexible. This time of transition cannot be and should not be rushed. It will take as long as it needs to take. In the early parts of the transition, the church Council and I will work together to make sure the transition happens at an appropriate pace. You already are flexible, so continue to be what you already are.

In this time of transition, you have an opportunity. Take the opportunity to reflect on where you have been and where God might be calling you to go. What might God be calling you to do next. Be open to God working through you and be open to seeing and embracing the work of the Holy Spirit.

Last but not least, trust in God and be in persistent prayer. Remember as the Prophet Jeremiah reminds you, God has a plan. God has a plan for you.

Our time together will be about discerning what God's plan is for you the faithful people of Saint John's Lutheran in Coplay. For now, be at peace.




## SUNDAY SCHOOL INSTALLATION ON RALLY DAY!



#### **APPLE WALNUT CAKE**

4 cups coarsely cut apples

2 cups sugar

2 eggs

½ cup vegetable oil

2 tsps vanilla

2 cups flour

2 tsps baking soda

1/2 tsp cinnamon

1 tsp salt

1 cup walnuts, chopped

- 1. Combine apples and sugar, let stand until sugar gets moist.
- 2. Beat eggs slightly; beat in oil and vanilla in small bowl.
- 3. Mix flour, baking soda, cinnamon and salt in a bowl.
- 4. Add egg mixture and flour mixture together.
- 5. Stir in apple-sugar mixture and walnuts.
- 6. Pour into greased and floured 9 x 13 in. pan.

Bake at 350 degrees for 35 minutes.

Let stand in pan until quite cool. Turn onto rack to complete cooling. Enjoy!


