





BASIL BALSAMIC CHICKEN

- 1 ½ pounds (approx. 6 pieces) chicken thighs, boneless and skinless
- ½ cup balsamic vinegar
- 3 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil
- 3 tbsp. fresh basil, minced

1 garlic clove, minced salt and pepper to taste

1 tbsp. fresh chives, chopped

2 tsp. lemon zest

- 1. Whisk together all ingredients except chicken. In a bowl, toss chicken with 1/3 cup of the mixture and let stand for 10 minutes.
- 2. Cover and grill chicken over medium heat for 6-8 minutes per side. Drizzle with remaining mixture and serve with a side! Enjoy!
